This week we have read many books related to our "All About Me/Five Senses" unit. The Bill Martin Jr./ Eric Carle book, Polar Bear Polar Bear and I Went Walking are quickly becoming favorites.

We discovered last week that the letter Aa has two different sounds and we have been trying to use this knowledge during

writing workshop. This week we studied the consonants, m, s and t. The children worked in small groups with me using our sand, felt paper and glue letters to explore sounds and letter formation. We made words like, at, am,

sat and mat. Three alphabet projects were available for the children to make. Some made a stop signal while others sorted pictures that began with t or m and were then glued on a turtle or monkey. We also had a great time learning about our sense of taste. The children enjoyed learning their tongue picks up sweet, sour, salty and bitter tastes in different areas on the tongue. We used our sense of taste

to figure out what was in different containers since our other senses weren't enough to identify the substances. The children were amazed to discover that although two ingredients look very similar, they can have very different tastes. We captured sound waves in a tube and watched as they made our rice dance. The week ended with the children making awesome Christopher Columbus scenes in honor of the upcoming holiday. They look great in our hallway!

Math

The children continue to explore the different math manipulatives we have in the room. We played a new game called the Tens Game which is already a favorite. The children stand in a circle and count in order one at a time from one to ten. When a child lands on ten they sit down. Play continues until only one child is left standing. The pattern is different each time we play which makes it exciting! The children continue to enjoy the Guessing Jar and this week many children made interesting guesses. Today we counted the jar and figured out how many Smarties were inside.

Ask your child for the total. Here are the new math activities your children started this week on their 2nd math center sheet; blobs, Spin a Number Game, unifix cubes, math books, hippo number matching, 5 senses sort, bug counting, sweet, sour and salty graphing and ceramic tiles. Our first monthly calendar came home yesterday. I hope you liked it. The October calendar makes a great Halloween decoration!
