English Language Arts

Our Fall Fun unit has begun! The week began with the reading of a traditional rhyme called, In A Dark, Dark Wood. We used spooky voices to read this book and I kept the ending a secret for a few days. As a table top activity, each child had the opportunity to predict how the story would end through drawing and writing. Following the writing activity, we read



our ideas and then finished reading the original ending to the story. Be sure to ask your child what was officially in the box. The children enjoyed reading a book called, <u>Big Pumpkin</u>. It was all about a witch who wants to make



pumpkin pie but can't get her pumpkin off the vine. Next week the children will complete a sequencing activity placing the characters in order according to when they pulled on the pumpkin.

We used black socks to make cool bats during the week after reading our amazing bat fact books. These awesome bats are hanging in our room making it feel like a bat cave. Maybe you'll be able to stop by

and take a peek some day soon!

We began the week by listening to the letters Hh, Oo and Rr. The sound cards for these letters are as follows; "Hot Soup," "Block O," and "Roaring Lion". The children pretend they are fanning their mouths with hot soup in them for the letter Hh. We formed a building block for the vowel Oo and outlined our mouths with our pointer finger to make the short o vowel sound. One hand goes under our chins like a claw for the letter Rr as we pretend we are roaring lions with sharp claws.

We sponge painted candy corn patterns today. They look beautiful in the hallway.

Math

Our guessing jar had Twix bars in it from last week. Make sure you ask your child how many were in the jar. The children enjoyed playing the copy cat game as well as the Tens game again this week. We are hoping to wrap up the center sheet we have been working on over the past 2 weeks with the following activities; A 5

senses sheet requiring students to sort pictures into correct categories according to specific senses. Bug spot counting, Hippo number match, people/flower math box, lids math box and number match game. Through the use of the math boxes the children have had many opportunities to create groups that compare fewer, more and equal to.
