

English Language Arts

This week we have read some fantastic books. Everyone found <u>Our</u> <u>Seasons</u> to be very informational. It is hard for the children to imagine winter being cold and snowy here, while it is summer on the other side of the globe! We took a look at Mystery Science and have begun recording our weather looking for patterns in our science journals. Everyone was excited to finally get to build our



wall mural based on the book, <u>A House for</u> <u>Hermit Crab</u>. We made speech bubbles for our crabs that tell what makes a good friend which also ties into this week's religion unit.Cookie's Week continues to be a favorite story and we are hoping to create a



sequel next week. The children will have a fun time creating new adventures for Cookie.

We have begun to explore open and closed vowel sounds. I have been showing the children how a consonant blocks in a vowel and it makes the vowel sound short. When it is not blocked by a consonant the vowel is long. We open and shut a door on houses to demonstrate this concept. Being

able to identify these vowels within words will help the children read. Next week they will have fun opening and closing the door on little paper houses to help them identify the open (long) and closed (short) vowel sounds and then read the words. **Report cards** came home today and there is a sticker inside the envelope for your child. Please let me know if you have any questions.

Math

We continue to explore addition and subtraction with lots of practice adding and subtracting to 5. We have also been looking at the number partners for 10. The children have a fantastic understanding of this concept already. The class has enjoyed acting out different number sentences using fruits and vegetables from our kitchen area. We also enjoyed partnering up to play a guessing game to find the missing partners for 7. The children had fun singing the Addition Boogie song again using the Promethean Board. Math Blaster Homework: Hopefully all went well with the third math homework. The children have been doing a great job at bringing their homework back on time! The Guessing jar had Dum Dum lollipops in it this week. Ask your child for the total.

We will be celebrating Valentine's Day on **Tuesday, February <u>13th</u>**.
