## English Language Arts

Our Joy Cowley unit is coming to an end today. We have enjoyed reading many of our favorite books this week like, Do Not Open This Book, Mrs. Wishy Washy and Mud Walk. Today we created a science investigation involving edible mud. We discussed why we thought some animals like mud and made our own theories after creating "chocolate pudding mud" and feeling it on our fingers! It was a great way to end our Joy Cowley unit! After Easter we will begin to work on writing How To books. The children will work on adding lots of details to their writing as well as pictures to get their points across. We will continue to how diagrams can
 help to make things clear to the reader. Next week
 we will begin our dinosaur unit. As usual, if you have any materials on this topic that you think we might be able to use please send them in with your child's name clearly marked on the items.

## Math

The children enjoyed playing a couple of sorting games this week. People sorting is a favorite. Children sit or stay standing according to specific characteristics like wearing black socks. The game continues until no one is left standing. We also did some large group people addition and subtraction story problems. Read My Mind is our silent sorting game which we hope to play today. We began a new center sheet last Friday but I didn't give you a description of each activity so here it is; Cookie Sort- students color and sort different cookies and then glue them into the correct cookie jar, Butterfly measuring- students draw and paint a butterfly and then use cubes and a ruler to measure the wing span. Mrs. Wishy-Washy Spin, tally, graph and add. Students spin a spinner with a duck, cow and pig tallying which was landed on (10 times) then use the data to create a bar graph and addition number sentences. Shape Sort- students draw flat shapes and then cut apart shapes to sort and glue into the correct category. Math journals- Students are classifying objects in 3 different ways recording and labeling the objects in their journal.
 Arithmetic Bingo game- students play this game using 2 dice, and bingo boards. They roll dice and add them together covering the appropriate number. The person with 4 in a row is the winner.

## Red Words

We added the word, said to our red word booklets. We continue to practice previous words using lots of different kinds of materials. I'm working on getting the children to use them without coaching from me when they write independently.
